The criminal careers of the Barrow brothers, Clyde and Marvin, began with petty thefts. Many officers expressed the opinion that they were always petty thieves — their largest "haul" amounted to \$3500—shooting because of a haunting fear of arrest. But shoot they did. Officers in iowa, Missouri, Kansas, Arkansas, Oklahoma and Texas attempted to capture Barrow and members of his gang, to be met with deadly gunfire from the outlaw or, just as frequently, that of the trigger-girl, Bonnie Parker.

Clyde and Marvin Barrow started their life of crime in Dallas and San Antonio, where they were arrested many times on suspicion before being convicted of any offense. In January, 1930, the brothers and two other men were captured in Henrietta, Tex, in a stolen automobile, and received their first prison sentences.

Marvin was sentenced to four
years in the Texas penitentiary at
Huntsville and Clyde was sent to
Waco, where he pleaded guilty to
two burglaries and the theft of five
autos. On March 8 Marvin walked
quietly from the penitentiary, and quietly from the penitentiary, and three days later Clyde and two companions sawed their way out of the

three days later Clyde and two companions aswed their way out of the Waco jail.

Clyde was recaptured at Middleton, Ohio, March 18 and returned to Waco, from where he was sent to Huntsville April 21 under total sentences of 14 years, two years each on seven counts.

He was a "model prisoner" but went to extremes to escape prison work. Fellow convicts told that once he cut his foot with an ax deliberately to avoid an unpleasant task. On February 2, 1932, he was released on a general parole. The parole was revoked the following November. Clyde Barrow had killed three men by then.

Meanwhile, in: December, 1931, Marvin startled prison guards at Huntsville by knocking at the gate and asking admittance. He said that he had married, and his wife and he decided it would be best for him to return and complete his sentence.
