

REMOVAL OF THE REMAINS OF GOV. ALLEN.

A bill was passed at the last meeting of the Legislature appropriating \$1000 to defray the expenses of removing the remains of Gov. Henry Watkins Allen, the war Governor of Louisiana, from this city to the State-House grounds in Baton Rouge.

Gov. Allen died in Mexico. The remains were brought to New Orleans and placed in an ordinary tomb in Washington Street Comotory. When the monument was in process of erection they were removed to another tomb, and afterward reinterred beneath the monument. On the last occasion the bones were placed in a tin case, together with some rolls.

Capt. W. I. Hodgson, who has charge of the arrangements for the removal of the remains, has had a conversation on the subject with Mr. Garig, of Baton Rouge, a member of the committee to receive them.

It is proposed to cause the removal of the remains and monument to Baton Rouge next month, and to distinguish the occasion by a reunion at the capital of Allen's Regiment, the 4th Louisiana, and other ceremonies commemorative of the life of Louisiana's famous Governor. These ceremonies will take place about Feb. 25.
