NOE PROPOSES BOND TO SERVE

Administration Hopeful Hits at Rumor

BATON ROUGE, La. (AP)—Former Gov. James A. Noe, candidate for governor with backing of Gov. Earl K. Long, played his chips hard and fast Saturday in the campaign.

Angry at charges Noe would step aside, if elected, to let Long take over, Noe drafted a \$100,000 performance bond to be filed with the state treasurer.

"It is," the wealthy Monroe and New Orleans television and radio executive said, "in effect a performance bond in the amount of \$100,000 payable to the old age pension fund if I fail to fulfill my solemn obligation to serve the people of Louisiana as their governor for the four-year term . . ."

Noe said he would file this affidavit "the very day and hour that New Orleans Mayor de Lesseps S. Morrison agrees to deposit a similar bond of \$100,000 with the same treasurer of the state of Louisiana; again, for the benefit of the old age pension fund and payable on the date I complete my four years in office."

Noe, with Long running as lieutenant governor candidate on an administration ticket, grumbled that a few hours after he had qualified for governor, Morrison was quoted in news stories as saying:

"If Noe is elected governor, he will not serve one day, but will resign to permit Earl Long, who is running for lieutenant governor, to become governor."

If Morrison made the statement, Noe asserted, "I am shocked and astonished—and prepared to challenge the truth of Mayor Morrison's speeches right from the start of this campaign."

At Amite Saturday morning, Noe told a political rally he decided to run for governor only to help the people of Louisiana. He said he now has enough money to provide for all his needs, and he is not interested in gaining more wealth. He wants only to serve.

Noe was accompanied by his entire ticket. Gov. Long told the crowd his thought has always been, even while people thought him insane, to aid the people. He said he conducted "a long search for a gubernatorial candidate and finally came up with the best man, former Gov. Noe."
