

## 12 MURDERS, MANY ROBBERIES AMONG BARROW'S CRIMES

### Kidnapings, Bank Hold-Ups and Beatings Charged to Outlaw, Band

Twelve murders, more than 100 automobile thefts, several bank robberies, and scores of petty hold-ups, robberies, kidnapings and beatings during the past two years from the record of crime attributed to Clyde Barrow and his pack of outlaws.

Persons reported to have been slain by Barrow or his associates during the time included:

greatest man hunts, Barrow and his associates used tactics similar to those of John Dillinger, confusing their pursuers by quick cross-country dashes and by shooting to kill when cornered.

The criminal careers of the Barrow brothers, Clyde and Marvin, began in 1930 in Dallas and San Antonio, where they were arrested many times on suspicion before being convicted of an offense. In January, 1930, the brothers and two other men were captured in Henrietta, Tex., in a stolen automobile, and received their first prison sentences.

Recaptured in Ohio, Marvin was sentenced to four years in the Texas penitentiary at Huntsville and Clyde was sent to Waco, where he pleaded guilty to two burglaries and the theft of five autos. On March 8 Marvin walked quietly from the prison and three days later Clyde and two companions sawed their way out of the Waco jail.

Clyde was recaptured at Middleton, Ohio, March 15 and returned to Waco, from where he was sent to Huntsville April 21 under a \$20,000 bond. In January, 1932, he was sentenced to 10 years, two years each on seven counts.

He was a "model prisoner" but went to extremes to escape prison work. Fellow convicts told that once he cut his foot with an ax deliberately to avoid an assignment to work on a general parole. The parole was revoked the following November. Clyde Barrow had killed three men by then.

Meanwhile, in December, 1931, Marvin started prison again at Huntsville by knocking at the gate and asking admittance. He said that he had married, and his wife and he decided it would be best for him to return and complete his sentence.

Clyde was identified as a participant in a hold-up of a Dallas oil company March 25, 1932, a few weeks after he was paroled. On April 27 he was involved in his first murder.

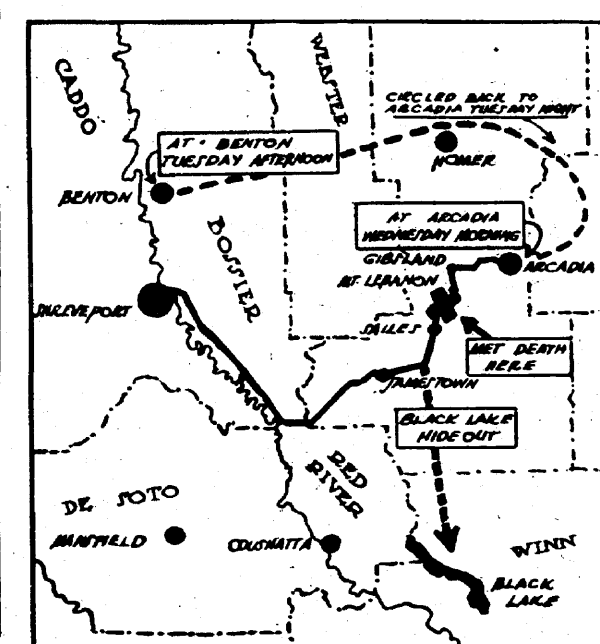

alive" probably would be paid to this informant.

Although inseparable in crime, Bonnie Parker and Clyde Barrow have been separated in death by Barrow's mother, who objected to double funeral services for the pair in Dallas. The grief-stricken mother said she would demand a separate funeral service for her boy.

The Rev. Clifford Andrews, pastor of Oak Cliff Foll Gospel church, will officiate at both services. Barrow will be buried beside his brother and Bonnie Parker by her niece.

The incongruity of the criminal mind was demonstrated by discovery that Clyde Barrow, while not toying with machine guns and revolvers, was a saxophone player. Nestled between guns and ammunition, a saxophone with several pieces of sheet music was found in the automobile.

More interesting to officers, however, were two riot guns, three sub-

machine guns, eight automatic pistols, a .28-caliber revolver and 2000 round of ammunition.

Under the front seat of the car, two magazines, one a detective story and the other a romance publication, were found. In a trunk on the rear of the car was a large bag containing clothing and license plates, and a small overnight kit held Bonnie's lipstick, powder and personal effects.

On the floor under the front seat a partially eaten sandwich was found, indicating that Bonnie was eating the sandwich at the time of the officers' attack.

Handbag Disappears

Another handbag, believed to belong to the woman, disappeared from the car in the rush of the crowd of curious before the officers could check the contents.

The couple's life became more and more harried of late as the law gradually closed in around them. Darting out of an isolated retreat at midnight, they would drive at furious speed to some other rendezvous—sometimes several hundred miles away. Resting only a few hours, they would dash on again.

Bonnie Parker was believed to have been with Barrow and his brother Marvin, when a posse cornered the gang near Texier, La., July 24, 1933. Marvin was killed but Clyde and Bonnie Parker escaped.

Hold Inquest

A coroner's jury late today heard the officers' account of the killing and returned a verdict holding that Barrow and the Parker woman were killed by officers "in the line of duty."

The bodies of the slain couple were then placed on exhibition to all wishing to view them. They had not decided on their disposition.

## 'Prayed to See Him Again,' Says Sobbing Mother

Dallas, Tex., May 22.—Mrs. Henry Barrow, mother of Clyde Barrow, Southwest killer slain in Louisiana, cried out in anguish today when informed her son had been shot down. "And I prayed only last night that I might see him alive again, just once more," she sobbed.

Mrs. Emma Parker, mother of Bonnie Parker, killed with Clyde, fainted when informed by telephone that her child, too, had been killed. Mrs. Parker refused at first to believe the report.

"Where did it happen?" she asked. "Near Gibland, La. Do you have any relatives there?" "No, but you must be kidding me."

"There is no mistake. Both of them were killed."

The telephone was heard to drop and Mrs. Parker screamed. Another woman took the phone to find out definitely that the couple had been slain.

## Ranger and Sheriff Tell Their Stories of Desperadoes' Finish

### Tip Led to Capture, Sheriff Jordan Reveals

Most Cunning Criminal, Ranger Says of Barrow

Editor's note—The following extensive description of the search for Clyde Barrow and his girl companion, Bonnie Parker, which resulted in their death, was given the International News Service by Frank Hamer, former captain of the Texas Rangers, one of the men who were in tracing the fugitives led directly to the ending of their careers.

Arcadia, La., May 23.—In the 30 years that I have been running down criminals and outlaws, I have never pursued a man who used the cunning and elusive tactics of Clyde Barrow.

A group of four officers, including B. M. Gault and I, have been definitely on the trail of Barrow for four months. The pursuit took us thousands of miles and into several states.

Finally we were able to set a trap for him and his woman companion. They walked squarely into it early today.

We gave them a fair break, which they have never given anybody else. We ordered them to surrender. They refused to accept the break we gave
