

GOVERNOR ALLEN'S REMAINS.

Ceremonies Attending Their Removal to Baton Rouge.

NEW ORLEANS, July 3—The ceremonies attending the removal of the remains of ex-Governor W. H. Allen from this city to Baton Rouge, took place to day, according to programme. The remains were removed by the surviving members of the Allen Monumental Association from the cemetery to Johnson & Son's undertaking establishment, where they were newly encased. This evening the remains were removed from the undertaker's to Washington Artillery Hall, where they remain under military protection during the night. At 7 o'clock to-morrow morning the remains will be taken to Baton Rouge under military and civic escort for final interment under the monument which has been removed to that city, having been presented to the State by the Allen Monumental Association. A feature of the ceremonies this evening was a procession of the children and grandchildren of ex-Confederate soldiers who preceded the pall bearers, each child carrying flowers and strewing them along the street in front of the remains and escorts.
