

The Bingham, one of the transports belonging to the Spanish expedition against Mexico, has arrived at the Balize, in distress; and the Spanish Consul has addressed a letter to Gov. Derbigny, requesting that the troops, about 500 in number, may be permitted to land, until another transport can be obtained, or the Bingham can be repaired.—Governor Derbigny is disposed to do for their relief all that the duties of hospitality require, and a strict observance of neutrality will permit. He therefore permits them to land, and to remain on the spot assigned to them, during the time absolutely necessary for procuring some other transport, or for repairing the Bingham with all possible speed, if no other vessel can be obtained.

The Bingham was separated from the rest of the convoy in a violent tempest, on the 11th July, and it is reported that several others of the squadron had put into Pensacola, having suffered in the same gale which disabled the Bingham.
