

HENRY FUQUA WINS RACE IN LOUISIANA

RETURNS INDICATE HE DE-
FEATED BOUANCHAUD BY
OVER 21,000 VOTES.

NEW ORLEANS, La., Feb. 20.—
Henry L. Fuqua was leading New-
itt Bouanchaud by 21,200 votes
when 173,180 votes cast in the
Democratic run-off primary Tues-
day for Governor had been tabu-
lated Wednesday afternoon.

The vote was: Fuqua 97,190;
Bouanchaud 75,990.

Fuqua carried New Orleans by
nearly 15,000 votes and had a ma-
jority of more than 6,000 votes in
the country parishes.

In the first primary Bouanchaud
carried the country parishes by a
plurality of about 13,000 votes.

The Fuqua victory in New Or-
leans indicated the return to pow-
er of the old regular Democratic
organization which led among oth-

ers by Martin Behrman, for many
years Mayor, was ousted three
years ago when the new regulars
defeated Behrman and installed
Andrew McShane as the city's chief
executive.

Tabulation of the vote cast for
candidates of the other four State
offices at stake in the primary was
far behind that polled for the gov-
ernatorial candidates. The fig-
ures were:

Lieutenant Governor, Paul N.
Cyr, 29,425; O. H. Simpson, 26,848;
Attorney General, A. V. Coco, 27,
615; Percy Saint, 26,782; Auditor,
Justin Denechaud, 25,471; T. O.
Harris, 20,668; Treasurer, L. B.
Baynard Jr., 27,794; Fernand Mou-
ton, 28,357.
