## DOMESTIC NEWS.

### NEW YORK

NEW YORK, July 6.—A stay of proceedings has been granted in the case of Foster by Judge Peath, of Brooklyn. The Court of Error is made returnable November 8th.

Governor Hoffman, on application of Judge Stuart, has appointed next Monday to hear the prayer and argument for the commutation of Foster's sentence to imprisonment for life.

If the Governor so decides all further legal proceedings will be at once suspended.

President Grant gave a favorable hearing yesterday to a number of ex-army officers, asking the intercession of this government to save the life of the Cuban General Cavada and referred the matter to the Department of State for consideration and action.

George Morris, Thomas Cary and William Olney, all young men, were drowned in Long Island Sound by the upsetting of a small boat.

They were intoxicated when they went out.

### KANSAS.

ATCHISON, July 6.—The bridge over the Nemaha River, on the Atchison & Nebraska Railroad, was completed on Saturday last.

Regular trains commenced running to-day between Atchison and Falls City, fifty-eight miles northwest of this city.

### OHIO.

CINCINNATI, July 6.—Two soldiers from Newport Barracks went to a boarding house on Pearl street last night and engaged a room.

At four o'clock this morning one of them was found dead, with a bullet through his head, and the other one was scarcely alive, also with a ball in his head.

No explanation of the matter has been reached.

### Miscellaneous Dispatches.

NEW ORLEANS, July 8.—About ten o'clock a. m. Samuel Kainig, book-keeper in the New Orleans National Bank, while at his desk, was shot and almost instantly killed by Wm. Boyd.

This homicide is the result of a former business complication. Boyd was arrested.
