

**NEW ORLEANS PAPERS** to the 10th of March, furnish the following intelligence —

The remains of the Hon. Jacques Villere, formerly Governor of Louisiana, were interred on the afternoon of the 8th. In bringing over his grave, a ball from one of the guns, put in by some accident or carelessness, killed a boy about 11 years of age, who was standing opposite.

Four persons of color (free men) were arrested 8th March, on charge of circulating "Walker's Appeal," alias "the diabolical Boston Pamphlet." Their names are Robert Smith, Samuel Doudan, Ned, and one other.

The Legislature of Louisiana has passed a law to prohibit the introduction of free persons of color, and to expel all those who have arrived within the State since 1825. They are ordered to leave it within sixty days.

The Mercantile Advertiser of the 10th, copies from the Texas Gazette, certain documents declaring the Department of Texas exempt from the Decree abolishing slavery throughout the Mexican Republic — The number of slaves in the Department is stated to be upwards of 1000. It is strictly forbidden, however, to introduce slaves from abroad.

An outrage of a most atrocious character was lately committed, and in its consequences was near producing a riot. A man of respectable character, who kept a sailors' boarding house, was walking towards home, with his wife one evening, when he was met by a young man named Ker, also of respectable connexions, who without the slightest acquaintance, or the least provocation, insulted the wife with indecent language and actions; on the husband attempting to interfere, the aggressor drew a pistol and shot him through the body. He was instantly taken and lodged in prison; but next morning was liberated on bail. His enlargement under the circumstances, so incensed a number of sailors, that they assembled and "showed some signs of commencing a riot." In this crisis, the Mayor of the city called on the military, and such sailors as had behaved disorderly (to the number of about eighty) were taken up and lodged in prison. Meantime, it appears that the original offender had escaped.

A carrot, raised in the garden of Dr Samuel Harris, Camden, N. J., measured fifteen inches in circumference, is two feet six inches in length, and weighs four pounds.

The editor of the Annapolis Republican tells of a black man having killed four swans, at a single shot, last week on South river.

According to the Camden, S. C. Journal, seven respectable men, of that neighborhood, having leased a gold mine, found at the end of two months, that they had spent one hundred and twenty dollars, and procured gold worth something more than three.

On Tuesday, at the Boston Police Court, a man named Mone and a colored man named Curle, were severally fined \$1 and cost, for keeping dogs contrary to law. Curle paid for his dog; but Mone could not raise the "ready," and was committed to jail.

Several runaway negroes were recently arrested in Bryan county, Ga. among whom was Spampson, the property of Dr. W. H. Waring, who murdered a man two years ago at Savannah.
