

THE REMAINS OF GENERAL TAYLOR.—
“The committee of eighteen appointed by the Governor of Louisiana to make arrangements for the burial of the remains of General Taylor in Louisiana, have held a meeting at New Orleans, at which an interesting letter was read from Governor Walker, dated Baton Rouge, in which he says:—Immediately after receiving certain information of the death of the late President, General Z. Taylor, I addressed a letter to Mrs. Taylor, through Col. Bliss, expressing what I believed to be the wishes of the people of Louisiana, that his remains be brought to this state for burial, and proceeded at once to appoint a committee to proceed to Washington, for the purpose of escorting the body to this state, to be interred within the borders, at some place hereafter to be designated—at this place I presume.”
